COP26 Update- from Jenny



This is a welcomed reflection from Jenny, who is still in Glasgow:

"Glasgow is definitely the place to be! Last week and for the rest of this week the UN climate summit, COP 26, has been meeting here and there's a real buzz about the place. There are huge numbers of people around: thousands in the actual conference centre, both negotiators and representatives of affected communities, businesses, and others with an interest in the outcome. Outside the conference there are even more people, all here to show how much the climate crisis matters to them, and to demand urgent action by the politicians.

I'm there with a large team from Christian Aid. We have colleagues in what's known as the Blue Zone, where the negotiations are happening, and they come from Kenya and Bangladesh as well as from the UK, They've been incredibly busy talking to negotiators and advisers from all regions of the world, challenging them to be ambitious and courageous in coming to the sort of agreements that are necessary if global heating is to be stopped before it's too late.

The rest of us have been based in a church not far from the Blue Zone, using it as our base for meeting church leaders from around the world, holding discussions where they can share experiences of the climate crisis, and get to know each other so they can keep in touch and collaborate afterwards. We've heard inspiring stories from young people and from indigenous communities, whose voices are

so important but who are mostly not getting a hearing in the Blue Zone. This COP was billed as the most inclusive ever, but sadly that's not how it looks from here. Anything we can do to get them heard is hugely important: if the negotiators don't hear what it's like to be on the receiving end of the climate crisis, they won't understand how desperately the situation is.

The march through Glasgow on Saturday was a fabulous experience, despite the fact that (rather predictably!) it rained most of the time! The BBC estimated that 100,000 people took part, and it's so encouraging that so many people were prepared to brave the weather to show how much the climate crisis matters to them. It wasn't just in Glasgow: there were marches in London, over 40 other cities around the UK, and in many other locations around the world. This was truly a Global Day of Action. Let's hope that the negotiators take note.

Please continue to pray for the negotiations, that a spirit of justice and generosity will prevail, and that God's kingdom will come a little closer as a result."

Book Project for Refugees



This is a sample of the books that have been purchased to be sent to schools and organizations who are supporting a number of refugees mainly from Afghanistan. These are for students from 8-14 years old who need a variety of stories that can be read to them, or they can read for themselves depending on their level of English and interest. The Early Years' books that went to a Westminster organization a couple of weeks ago were very well received and will also help the young children with their English and enjoyment of the stories and pictures.

The older aged books were recommended by a number of young people of friends in that age group who chose them thinking of the authors and story lines that they have liked and enjoyed and hope their refugee peers would like too. Let us hope they do give the enjoyment they deserve after their traumatic journey. Just to thank those who made contributions towards the books. They were very welcome.

A Prayer for COP (the United Nations Conference of the Parties)



Green Christian's Co-Chaplain, Andrew Norman, in Glasgow, is leading simple and contemplative-style prayers for 10 minutes at 8am every morning from 1 to 12 November, based on Why Faith Matters at COP26. This is one of them:

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. Philippians 4:6." And rew said, "It is hard to imagine the world leaders coming up with an agreement at COP26 that preserves the abundance of Creation. That is why we need to pray, and in the words of Walter Wink, 'pray an alternative future into being."

Sustaining God as in November, at great cost and with great urgency the leaders of our species and those with concern for their common home are gathered in Glasgow, we ask for your welcoming, affirming presence in the many layers of gathering which are part of that event.

> Give to those who make decisions a freedom from the burdens of a past which have pushed us to this cliff-edge.

Give a dawning vision of your offer of healing greater than the blocked horizon of what it might cost

Argue and wrestle with the powers and principalities of expediency and despair

Open every human ear to the voices of the Earth, and of sisters, brothers, siblings who already suffer sharply

> Save us from the despair of complacency and the toxic temptation when the visitors have departed to embrace 'business as usual' for that 'normal' has gone

> > And our only future will be in wakefulness trust,

hope, yes, joy as we live out your love for the Earth we are part of through your Word made Flesh Jesus, our Friend.

> > Why Worry?



Recently I have been having quite a few discussions with friends about our capacity to worry about virtually everything; the kind of life our children and grandchildren will live; how safe or not it is for them to walk on the streets or travel by transport; whether the environment will be unspoilt by pollution; the increasing anger among people; the mismanagement by government; the widening gap between rich and poor, and, our own aches and pains that are preventing us doing the things we want to do and not wanting to rely on others to do things for us. What a list, it goes on and on. Then, by chance, I came across Mary Oliver's poem called "worrying" that stopped me in my tracks and made me laugh. She has a gift in her poetry of putting most things into perspective so I offer it to us. Mary was an American poet who won the National Book Award and the Pulitzer Prize. Her work is inspired by nature, rather than the human world, arising from her lifelong passion for solitary walks in the wild near her home. As one who loves solitary walks with my dogs, I know the healing property of walking (or sometimes hobbling) among trees and by water making you look at things differently. This poem, about our capacity to worry, is so apt to the conversations I have been having and the times we live in. Each of us could add our own worries, especially as we age, and certainly empathise with what she says about eyesight and rheumatism- oh certainly yes!!! But it ends with such hope, humour and joy and reminds us of Philippians 4, mentioned in the COP25 piece above, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God". As with Philippians we must add as Mary suggests, "going out into the morning and singing." We just might feel heaps better!

"Worrying" by Mary Oliver

"I worried a lot. Will the garden grow, will the rivers flow in the right direction, will the earth turn as it was taught, and if not how shall I correct it?

Was I right, was I wrong, will I be forgiven, can I do better?

Will I ever be able to sing, even the sparrows

can do it and I am, well, hopeless.

Is my eyesight fading or am I just imagining it, am I going to get rheumatism, lockjaw, dementia?

Finally I saw that worrying had come to nothing. And gave it up. And took my old body and went out into the morning, and sang."
